# **GREATER WORKS**

In speaking to His Apostles, our Lord made the following statement: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father." (John 14:12). Some might read this and wonder to whom our Lord is referring. Was it to the Apostles only? I want us to examine the statement and see what our Lord really meant.

Observe that Jesus said, "Greater works than these shall he do." He did not says, "greater miracles" because this would be impossible. After all Jesus was able to, and did, raise the dead. It would be impossible for anyone to per-form a greater miracle than this. How-ever, the Apostles did perform some of the same miracles that Jesus had per-formed. Jesus healed a man who had been lame for thirty-eight years (Jno. 5). Peter and John (by the power of the Holy Spirit) healed a man who had been lame from birth (more than forty years) (Acts 3; 4:22). Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11), and Peter raised Dorcas from the dead (Acts 9). The miracles that our Lord performed attested to the fact that He was the Son of God. Nicodemus said, "for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him" (Jno. 3:2). What is written has been written to pro-duce faith in Christ (Jno. 20:30-31). The miracles performed by the Apostles were for the purpose of confirming their words. We read, "And they went forth and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following." (Mark 16:20). Again we read that what they taught "was confirmed unto us by them that heard him: God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will." (Heb. 2:3-4). The Apostles were able to transfer the power of the Holy Spirit to others by the laying on of their hands (Acts 8:12-18; 19:6). Miraculous power ceased when the last Apostle died, and the last one on whom they had laid

hands died. By then God's perfect revelation to man was completed.

As mentioned earlier, Jesus did not say, "greater miracles" but He said "greater works." He was speaking of the work done during His personal ministry, and not of what would be accomplished after His return to the Father. The Gospel was not preached in its fullness and completeness until after Jesus had ascended back to heaven. The work, of which He was speaking, was what would be accomplished through the preaching of the Gospel. Let us notice how this was "greater" than what our Lord did while here on earth.

First of all, it was greater in SCOPE. Jesus' primary mission was to "... the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Matt. 15:24). However, the Apostles and others were to preach the Gospel in all the world to every creature (Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16).

Secondly, this involved greater VISIBLE RESULTS. Our Lord left but few followers when He left the earth, but the Apostles were able to make thousands. On the day of Pentecost when the Gospel was first preached, there were "about three thousand souls" converted (Acts 2:41). By the time you get to Acts 4:4 "...the number of the men was about five thousand." Read the rest of the book of Acts and you will find the number multiplying greatly.

In the third place, there were greater BLESSINGS IMMEDIATELY RECEIVED. Jesus opened the eyes of the physically blind (Jno. 9). However, the Apostles opened the eyes of the spiritually blind. (Acts 26:17-18; 2 Cor. 4:1-4).

Jesus healed the sick (Matt. 4:23), but the Apostles healed sick souls by preaching the gospel which is "...the power of God unto salvation ...." (Rom. 1:16).

Jesus restored the ear of Malchus that had been cut off (Lk. 22:51), but the preaching of the gospel restored the soul (Acts 20:32).

Jesus fed the hungry (Jno. 6) where about five thousand men were fed, but the Gospel is able to feed the soul (Matt. 4:4; 1 Pet. 2:2).

Jesus raised the dead (Jno. 11) but the Gospel can raise those who are dead in sin (Eph. 2:1; Rom. 6:1-6; 2 Cor. 5:17).


From the above, we can begin to see what Jesus had in mind when He said, "greater works." He concluded by saying, "because I go to my Father." This shows that He was comparing His work done while He was on earth with what they would be able to do later. In reality, what the Apostles did was done for Christ, as is what we accomplish to-day. When we teach God's Word we are doing the greatest work that any human can ever do. Let us be busy sowing the seed of the kingdom, and wait for God to give the increase.


